London Women v Tottenham Hotspur 4 - 3 **South East and London Regional League—Premier Division**

The first match of the season saw the new look team travel to play London Women.

Spurs were caught cold in the first minute of the game, when the London winger skipped past two tackles and had a speculative shot. This looped up in the air and Spurs failed to clear their lines and the ball went over the head of Laura to make it 1-0. This shocked Tottenham into life, as they started playing some nice football and had a few chances. Then another lapse in concentration led to a free kick, seemingly harmlessly near the half way line. A hopeful punt forward ended up bouncing straight over the keeper and into the back of the net for 2-0.

Lots of Spurs pressure followed and some excellent passing play, which saw them take the game to London and the team were rewarded near the end of the half with a goal straight from a Rosi Webb corner, that was fumbled into the net by the keeper bringing it back to 2-1 at the break. There were some changes on the half time whistle, as debutant Chanelle Breen was taken off and replaced by Geena Gordon.

In the second half, Spurs continued their passing game and were again rewarded after good work down the right hand side from player of the match Samrawit Bereket, who crossed the ball where it was volleyed into the roof of the net by Geena Gordon to level things up at 2-2. Spurs continued to press for the winner and were ahead for the first time after more good work and interplay from Webb, Homer and Bereket, with the winger crossing the ball for a glancing header from Homer to end up in the back of the net.

With Spurs fully in control of the game, the referee awarded London a dubious penalty, that was slotted home to peg Tottenham back at 3-3. With the young Spurs side rocked by some atrocious refereeing decisions, London took advantage and scored a fourth to deny Spurs a point.

Manager Jackie Fearon said after the game, "There were lots of positives to take from the match, from a young side that will become stronger and stronger."

Sawbridgeworth Town v Cambridge Rangers 1 - 1 **Eastern Region League—Division One west**

I suppose it could be an expectation that the first league game of the season would be a lack lustre affair with both side too intent on not losing than going out to win the game. A very tentative approach by Sawbo allowed errors to come into the game that had not been there during pre-season and players were not able to keep control of the ball as the pressure of the first game took its toll.

Both teams were suffering in the heat of the day and as a result the football was not a spectacle. Sawbo were during the first period slightly the better side as they actually tried to keep possession but too many forward balls were played direct where an angled approach would have seen more openings appear. On 13 minutes the beginning of good approach play saw a cross from Judith Duffin turned around for a corner which resulted in a goal kick to Cambridge. The pace of Duffin down the flank was causing the Cambridge defender a major problem and again on 21 minutes a cross from Duffin just eluded the forwards as they ran in. The game was now being played end to end but with no real conviction as to attempts on goal.

The second half continued in the same vane and early Sawbo substitutions saw Jo Gregory replace Hannah Fraser and Carlye Stein replace Jackie Stott. Sawbo kept trying to penetrate the Cambridge defence but most efforts fell short. Cambridge on a rare venture into the Sawbo box managed to be allowed to have time on the ball with two defenders and a goalkeeper in close proximity to pick her spot and slide the ball into the net for the first goal, a horrendous defensive error which up until that moment did not seem as if it could happen. As time was running out the longest passing movement of the game saw the ball fall to Stein who drove the ball from some 30 yards into the roof of the net for the equaliser on 80 minutes. The last 10 minutes saw an almost one sided affair as Sawbo now found the desire to go for goal but time ran out and the first game of the season ended with the scores level.



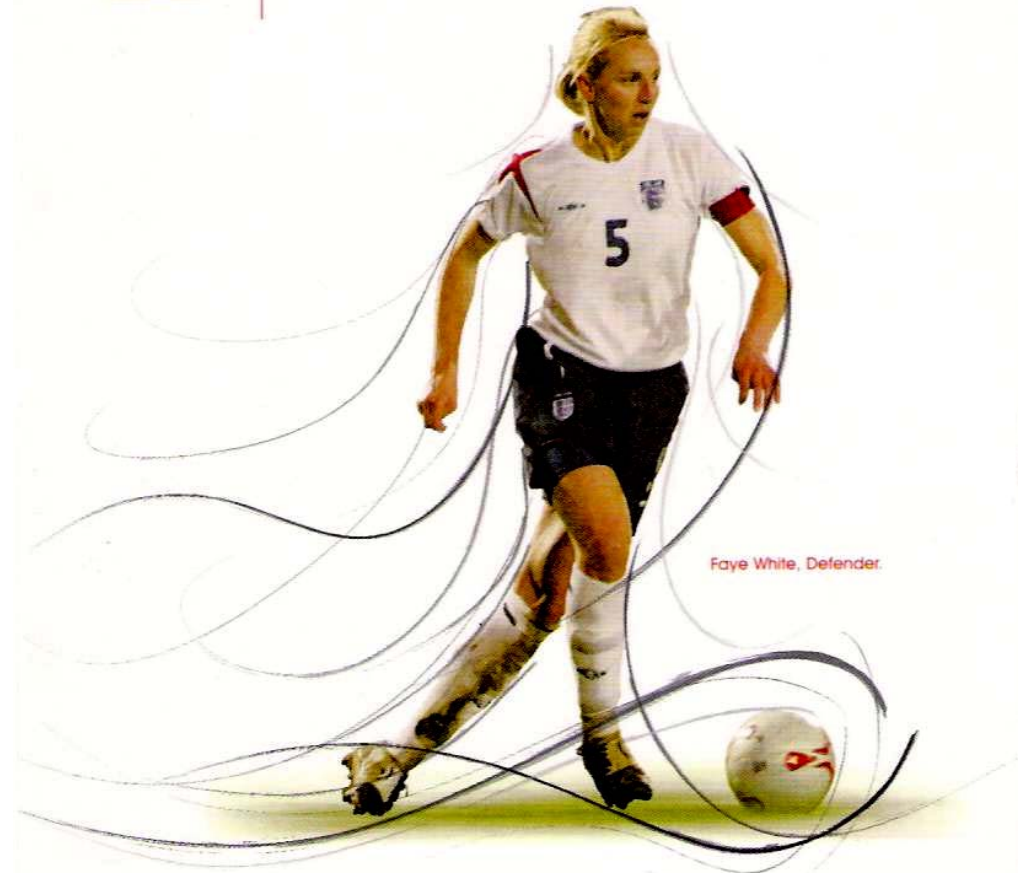
